Parliamentary inquiry: Supporting families of missing people

The United Kingdom's first ever Parliamentary inquiry into support for families of missing people will take place this month. With evidence being heard from public, private and voluntary sector representatives, as well as families themselves, this will examine existing support for families and whether any improvements are needed.

Run through the All Party Parliamentary Group for Runaway and Missing Children and Adults, the inquiry will take place over the following four sessions:

- Cross matching unidentified bodies with missing person reports
 Thursday 23 June, 10:30 12:30
 Committee Room 5, House of Commons

Each of these sessions will be co-chaired by a cross-party panel of Parliamentarians, who, after hearing evidence, will consider recommendations as to how support for families of missing people can be improved. These will then be submitted to the Coalition Government for consideration.
